CANCER AWARENESS WEEK

Oral cancer remains the commonest form of cancer and cancer related deaths among Indians and this high prevalence is mainly due to avoidable risk factors such as tobacco and alcohol use, coupled with scarcity of accessible, preventive, and curative health care services in these countries. Oral cavity is easily accessible for screening and visible mucosal changes precede almost all oral malignancies. This is not only because India is the third largest consumer of tobacco but also because there is scarcity of screening services at population level, and when service are available there is a lack of awareness of seeking screening services. Thus, multiple barriers exist at the mass level.

International cancer day and cancer awareness week was organized By H.K.E's S Nijalingappa Institute Of Dental Sciences And Research, Kalaburagi in collaboration with District Health family welfare department from 4-2-2022 to 10-2-22 to educate the public about oral potentially malignant disorders manifest as distinct lesions before progressing to oral cancer which can be clinically detected by conventional oral examination . Principa;l DR Arvind Moldi and the staff of public health dentistry department Dr Subhash patil and Dr Naveen Karbhari, senior lecturer along with 10 house surgeons actively took part in the screening camps.

About 60 patients attended the screening camp on Februray 4th 2022 at Afzalpur Taluka government hospital, Jewargi on Februray 10th 2022. Health education for oral cancer scree3ning was done for patients attending the outpatient department. Patients were regarding various side effect of smoke and smokeless tobacco through the personnel interviews and direct examination of the oral cavity. Public were educated about the early signs with self examination and reporting, various treatments available for the oral health
