Objective:

To sensitize students to the harmful effects of tobacco use, equip them with skills to identify tobacco-related oral lesions, and train them in effective tobacco cessation counseling through evidence-based strategies and hands-on activities.

The program was attended by **Final Year BDS students** and **Interns**, who actively participated in both the lecture sessions and practical training.

Day 1 – Academic Sessions

1.Lecture: Sensitization – Tobacco-Associated Oral Mucosal Lesions

Speaker: *Dr. Pallavi Deshmukh*

*Professor & In-Charge, HOD, Oral Medicine & Radiology

Dr.Pallavi Deshmukh provided an insightful session on the clinical features, diagnosis, and management of oral mucosal lesions commonly seen in tobacco users. She emphasized early detection and timely intervention in preventing malignant transformation.

2. Lecture: Understanding Nicotine Dependence & Interventional Strategies for Tobacco Cessation

Speaker: Dr. Chandrashekar *Psychiatrist, GIIMS Kalaburagi

Dr. Chandrashekar shed light on the psychological aspects of nicotine addiction and presented practical intervention strategies. His session also included guidance on establishing and managing a Tobacco Cessation Centre within a clinical setting.

Day 2 - Hands-on Training & Assessment

- **Counselling Demonstration:** A live demonstration was conducted to show effective communication and counseling techniques tailored to tobacco users.
- **Group Activity:** Students were divided into groups and given case scenarios for roleplay, simulating real patient interactions.
- Assessment & Feedback: Participants were evaluated on their understanding, approach, and interpersonal communication during counselling. Constructive feedback was provided to enhance future performance.

The program successfully met its objectives, with enthusiastic participation and positive feedback from the attendees. Students reported increased confidence in identifying tobacco-associated oral conditions and counselling patients effectively
